THE RESIDENCY FILE

Law clerk in Missouri. Obama's campaign in Ohio. The Obama White House. DOJ under Merrick Garland — and a house in Maryland he still owns. His wife's résumé runs Cornell, Penn, Yale, two White Houses, a DC consulting firm. The word Alabama does not appear on it anywhere.

FOLLOW THE MONEY

89.4% of every dollar came from outside Alabama — \$637,469. Washington, DC alone gave \$252,216, nearly a third of the whole. Alabama citizens gave \$40,145, and that came from just fifty people. Three-quarters of his money came from PACs. He is funded by Washington, not by us.

THE VOTING RECORD

He voted to halt Operation Epic Fury while American troops were in harm's way — one of only two Alabama members to do it. Against voter ID. Against border security. Against tax cuts for workers and seniors. Twelve key votes, straight out of the Congressional Record. He chose the party line every time.

THE WALL OF SHAME

Fifteen Alabama corporate PACs wrote him \$78,500 — and he cast nine votes against the industries that signed those checks. Drummond's coal. Alabama Power's plants. Austal's shipyards. The Farmers Federation. They bought the access. Their workers paid for it.

BOUGHT BY BIG CRYPTO

Before one Alabama voter knew his name, Silicon Valley crypto billionaires spent \$2.7 million making him a household name here — 80% of every ad ever run for him. Not one of those ads said the word cryptocurrency. They picked Alabama's congressman before Alabama got the chance.
